



Eddie & Vinny's Brings Former Tavolino's Location Back to Life with Coastal Italian Concept

ince news broke in 2024 that Eddie and Christina Pozzuoli, and Paul Greenberg owners of the P Hospitality Management (which includes Corvina Seafood Grill and Prezzo Restaurants), were opening Eddie & Vinny's Coastal Italian in the former Tavolino Della Notte space in Coral Springs, anticipation has been high. On Monday, March 17, 2025 to new restaurant opened its doors to customers for the first time.

The anticipation was no surprise given Tavolino's popularity in its heyday. With its soulful Italian fare, ambitious cocktail program, and live entertainment, Tavolino -- the brainchild of Ed Pozzuoli Sr., Eddie's father -- was the place to be in Coral Springs. The couple had been with the iconic restaurant since 2012, helping it grow into what it ultimately became, before deciding to sell. They are now transforming the space into a modern spot that honors its storied past.

Eddie & Vinny's brings a taste of culinary excellence with fresh, seasonal cuisine inspired by the Italian seaside, an array of Italian classics, an exceptional wine list, sophisticated cocktails, and top-tier entertainment.

"This is a family business if ever there was one," says Eddie. "To be actively working to bring that space back to life and introduce something new and exciting to the community is a dream come true."

Tavolino premiered in 2007 by Pozzuoli Sr. and partner Thomas Genduso. For more than a dozen years the restaurant was a beloved neighborhood destination for diners seeking Italian cuisine and a bustling lounge scene with live music. The restaurant changed ownership in June 2019 and ultimately closed in March 2024.

The new 230-seat, indoor-outdoor space, designed by Anna Woodman and built by Cannatelli Builders, features a completely reimagined look that melds Mediterranean touches with contemporary elegance. Dark blues, caramel wood tones, brassy gold, and black & white touches create an atmosphere of opulence and sophistication. Views into the kitchen, spacious and airy dining area, and a swanky new bar and lounge will meld seamlessly into one another to create

a bustling and convivial atmosphere.

The Italian-inspired menu is led by award-winning Chef Jeff Tunks, the talent behind Corvina in Boca Raton; and Chef David Garcia, Corporate Executive Chef for Prezzo Restaurants. Garcia will now take on the role of Executive Chef at Eddie & Vinny's.

The menu features a variety of Raw & Cold Starters, Warm Appetizers, Salads, Fresh Pasta, Chicken, Fish, Prime Cuts, Sides and Desserts, promising a memorable dining experience for all.

Dishes include starters such as Blue Crab Bruschetta - Jumbo lump crab, Campari tomatoes, Stracciatella and grilled ciabatta; "Black & Blue" Seared Beef Carpaccio - black truffle aioli, charred cipollini onions, arugula and blue cheese; The Wagyu Meatball - crispy cheese polenta, marinara and basil ricotta cheese; Chargrilled Octopus - Heirloom tomato, cannellini beans, panzanella, tomato pesto and Ricotta Salata and Steamed PEI Mussels "Sorrento" -- sun-dried tomatoes, thyme, Limoncello cream, and grilled focaccia.

House-made pastas will be plentiful with dishes like Spicy Rigatoni Vodka; Malfadine Cacio E Pepe; Lobster Linguine Fra Diavolo and Lasagna "Timballo Teramo" - Abruzzo-style layered Crepe Lasagna, Wagyu Bolognese and Four Cheese Mornay. Entrees will run the gamut from steaks to seafood with dishes like Local Yellowtail Livornese with olives, capers, tomato and Pinot Grigio and a Tuscan Cowboy Ribeye Steak with rosemary & balsamic glazed cipollini onions. Of course, diners craving beloved classics (chicken parmigiana anybody?) will not be disappointed.

Freshly made desserts, an Italianinfluenced wine list, and various classic and creative cocktails will also be available.



RED FLAG WARNINGS

What Residents Need to Know

hank you to everyone who attended our pre-session Town Hall in January and completed our pre-session survey. Now, we are right in the middle of

our 60-day Legislative Session. This is the time when the state budget starts to solidify, and bills continue to move through the process. We have many good bills addressing insurance, housing, mental health, and workforce shortages making their way through the process. However, we also have controversial bills, such as lowering the age to purchase a long gun and making constitutional amendments more difficult to get on the ballot. You can follow all bills that have been filed at flhouse.gov. There, you can also read staff analyses and watch the committee debate and questioning. I will do my best to keep you updated during Session through our email newsletter and social media. If you have any questions, you can also reach out

via email. When Session is over, we will be scheduling Legislative Updates in the cities and in the District. In the meantime, if you need assistance with any of the state agencies, please do not hesitate to reach out to our district office in Coconut Creek City Hall. We are here to help in any way we can.

While we still have several committees and weeks to go before any bills become law, some of the bills I sponsored that have passed their first committee include:

HB 27 Social Worker Compact: this would make Florida a compact state and allow social workers who join the compact the ability to work in all compact states, which adds to a continuum of care.

HB 4023 - Officers and Employees of North Springs Improvement District, Broward County: this adds a prohibition for conflicting employment or contractual relationships to the charter of North Springs Improvement District.

Our office has scheduled two Florida Licensing on Wheels events in the district in April. These provide a convenient opportunity to renew your license, ID, or registration. These events are on April 4 in Margate from 10 am-2 pm and April 10 in Parkland from 10 am-2 pm by appointment only. Please reach out to Linda in our office at Linda. Beauport@flhouse.gov or 954-956-5600 to make an appointment.

PARKLAND UPDATE

ommunity has many definitions. Sometimes it looks like a fun night cheering for your child on the soccer field or helping a neighbor in need. And at times, while it may not be popular, it

involves bringing attention to public problems and working toward solutions.

One such issue facing Parkland is becoming increasingly apparent. I have visited our parks during the late afternoon and evening hours, and I am well aware of the number of motorized bike riders - mostly minors - speeding through park fields and on sidewalks. What further complicates the matter is that Parkland is having a problem with the misuse of both e-bikes, which run on 750 watts or less, and motorized bikes, which exceed 750 watts of motor power.

While our parks and suburban roadways provide the perfect backdrop for bike riding and endless fun outdoor activities for the family, we need to make sure we are teaching our kids to respect others, as well as the beautiful public spaces for which Parkland is known.

I recognize that many parents are diligently ensuring their children obey the park rules and respect public spaces. However, we continue to see young people speeding through the parks, on sidewalks, and in parking lots on e-bikes and motorized bikes. The misuse of these vehicles is becoming a threat to public safety in the City of Parkland.

Note that e-bikes have three classifications. Of all three e-bike classifications, not one goes above 28 mph. And, according to Florida law, if the motorized bike runs on more than 750 watts, you must be at least 16 years of age to operate it, because it is considered a moped or motorcycle.

In response to this growing concern, the City of Parkland Parks and Recreation Department, along with the Broward Sheriff's Office - Parkland District (B.S.O.), have initiated a community patrol dedicated to keeping everyone safe.

Please be aware that failing to abide by these laws could result in a citation or even arrest.

As you travel through our beautiful neighborhoods, remember that the City's Crime Prevention Team is actively patrolling to ensure safety in our area. Enjoy your bike rides while adhering to the rules of our City and the state of Florida. By following the rules and the law, we demonstrate respect for our neighbors and ourselves, we prioritize the safety of others, and we demonstrate our commitment to the importance of preserving our community.


